Big changes are coming up for Cloudhaven in this our 15th year of ministry. The Baileys are slowing down (getting old,) so having consulted with our Board of Directors, after the end of this year we will be reducing the scope of the ministry. In the main house we will no longer be accepting guests, offering services or serving meals. Beginning next year, we will still welcome guests in our guest house, but they will be responsible for their own meals—either via the guest house kitchen or in Cloudcroft.

Most importantly, to be clear to our faithful supporters and to ease our administrative workload, we will terminate our tax exempt ministry status at the end of this year. The Baileys will gratefully accept any free will offerings that guests may contribute to our utility, laundry and upkeep costs, but none will be tax deductible. All donations to Cloudhaven received after December 31st will be returned to you. We do need your continued help with our operational expenses as we finish up the year. Any Cloudhaven monetary assets left at the end of the year will be transferred to the presbytery Missions Committee of the Presbyterian Church in America to support church planting in New Mexico and El Paso, TX.

Due to weather concerns, and with thanks to master chefs Mike and Susan Newnam, instead of our annual Christmas at Cloudhaven celebration this year we are hosting a grand pig roast on September 30th—see sidebar. We hope that you can join us for this celebration of God's faithfulness! God has continued to use Cloudhaven for his purposes for these many years, and we look forward to seeing how he'll use this special place and us in the future. Your participation in this ministry has borne much fruit for God's kingdom.
